After more than a decade in development, SnapLoc has left the drawing board. It is a unique, new medium-tension, fabric-mounting system which offers cost-conscious architects and designers the opportunity to integrate code-compliant, fabric-upholstered walls into aesthetically appealing decors. SnapLoc is a medium-tension site-built fabric-mounting system.

The luxury of fabric-covered walls can now be created economically on site. The all too familiar undesirable sagging and unattractive unevenness-created by seasonal fluctuations in humidity and extended use has been successfully eliminated by the innovative design of the new SnapLoc system. Other systems often distort fabrics due to the inability to hold the material taut and square.

Monolithic, seamless, butt-joint, horizontal banded SnapLoc fabric-upholstered walls feature architectural detailing, including mitered corners, horizontal butt joints, and sound absorbing infill between fabric and the substrait. These are the kinds of details which make a special design job special - not just the standard look of adhered fabrics on the wall. Up to now, custom features have only been possible through costlier, time-consuming techniques. Most fabrics, inexpensive or luxury, thin or thick, with or without a separate lining, can easily be integrated into the SnapLoc system.
